

EDUCATIONAL LEARNING OBJECTIVES

After this activity, participants will be able to:

- 1. Develop a plan or protocol within their practice locations to optimize the evaluation and care of the patient with advanced cardiopulmonary disease including pulmonary hypertension or a chronic LVAD.
- 2. Articulate the safety lessons that can be learned from the aviation industry and apply them to the challenges of improving safety in the anesthesia workplace.
- 3. Recognize the special anesthetic risks of former premature infants and formulate plans for addressing frequent pediatric issues such as upper respiratory infections.
- **4.** Demonstrate familiarity with the new CDC guidelines for opiate use and develop strategies for the management of pain relief for patients with opioid tolerance or other substance use disorders.
- 5. Develop strategies for anesthesia and analgesia for outpatient total joint arthroplasty procedures.
- **6.** Identify barriers to improving obstetric outcomes in patients of differing racial and ethnic backgrounds.
