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Global Educational Learning Objectives:

1. Delineate options for anesthesia management in patients with chronic pain conditions or substance use disorders.
2. Outline factors contributing to nerve injury related to peripheral nerve blockade.
3. Understand the ethical implications related to anesthesia and ICU management in patients nearing end of life.

11. Differentiate pediatric patients for whom regional anesthesia will be beneficial.
12. Evaluate innovations in pediatric NORA care.
13. Explore the evolution of Artificial Intelligence (AI) use in preoperative risk evaluation.
14. Examine AI - based preoperative tool use in the real - world.
15. Identify practical applications of AI in anesthesiology, across short and longer time horizons, in the context of the current healthcare workforce and economic climate.
16. Understand how AI may impact different practice models uniquely and similarly, and why.

REMINDER: REIMBURSEMENT POLICY

The CSA Executive Committee approved an update to the CSA reimbursement policy for committee and board members.

For attendance at committee meetings, you will receive one night stay, and two days of expenses reimbursed. For attendance at board meeting, you will receive the same, IF you are attending both you will receive two nights, and three days of expenses.

Reimbursement requirements:

- To receive reimbursement for the April committee and board meetings you must be a registered attendee at the CSA Annual Meeting.
- For those flying, John Wayne the Orange County airport is the best choice. This is where CSA will be reimbursing taxis/rideshares for.
- We will NOT be reimbursing rental cars for this meeting.
- A receipt is required for all items you request reimbursement.
- Per diem is expenses up to \$100 per day (primarily food, but can include wifi, tips, etc.), you must have receipts for any request.
- Not eligible for per diem is purchase of a meal when one is already being provided as a portion of the event, this includes treats in addition to a provided meal (i.e. a dessert, beverages, etc.).
- Reimbursements must be submitted no later than 30 days of the event.
